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Medical Magnet Booster Club

This is our third and final newsletter of the 2010-2011 school year. It has been a wonderful year and our volunteers have worked hard. I would like to thank everyone who has helped support our teachers and students and who made this year successful.

In March, the Teacher Appreciation Week was coordinated by the PSTA, IB, University and Medical Booster Clubs. It was a very successful week. On Monday, we served the teachers and staff with a grab and go breakfast. A wonderful lunch was prepared for them on Wednesday along with entertainment from the school dance team and door prizes were awarded. On Friday, treats were put in everyone's mailbox for a surprise to end the week.

There were 103 students who went to the State HOSA competition March 31 – April 3 in Jacksonville, Florida. Seven students from Boca Ciega High School also went with our students. We had 41 students place in the competition and 10 students are eligible to go to National's in California this summer. We are very proud of them and our medical teachers for making this happen.

Our volunteers, coordinated by Shanni Davis, donated cookies for Discovery Night, which informs prospective Freshman about our program. We estimated that 900 students and parents attended Discovery Night. There were 605 applications for the 160 available freshman spots. There were 69 applications for sophomores.

Cookies and lemonade will be donated by the Booster Club for the Freshman Pinning to be held on May 5th. This is a special evening for the Freshman and their families where they are congratulated for finishing their first year and entertained by some of their classmates.

Still to come in May, we have the Senior Celebration dinner. The committee, lead by Sally Poulos, Terri Cabaniss and Terri Martin, has been working all year on this major event for our graduating seniors and their families. It will be held at Innisbrook on May 21st. Morton Plant Mease Foundation is providing the meals for every graduating senior in the program, as well as our faculty and invited guests. The Medical Magnet Booster Club awards two \$1,000.00 scholarships each year and the winners will be announced at the dinner.

On June 7th, the Booster Club will host a luncheon in appreciation of our Teachers. This is being organized by Tony Griffith. Tony has gotten a sponsor for the food this year. We will be asking our members to make donations for gifts for our Teachers and staff to thank them for all the hard work that they do during the year.
